



RADICAL FILM NETWORK (UN)CONFERENCE/FESTIVAL, 13-17 GIUGNO 2022

The Radical Film Network is an international network that brings together individuals and organizations involved in politically engaged and aesthetically innovative film culture – activists, academics, producers, distributors and exhibitors of film and video.

More than twenty years after the Genoa G8, the RFN annual gathering, suspended since 2020 due to the pandemic, comes to Genoa also (and especially) to think about and organize radical film practices for social movements in years to come.

Every day, there will be talks, discussions, workshops and screenings of shorts at the Albergo dei Poveri (13, 14, 15 June) and at DISFOR – Department of Education Studies (16, 17 June). Every night, from 12 to 17 June, there will be screenings and debates in people's cinemas, open-air spaces and independent cinemas in the city.
